

Built as the first LEED Silver certified hospital in Ontario, Woodstock General Hospital was constructed around a beautiful central courtyard, allowing natural light to enter patient rooms from every corner. The new facility set the tone; it set the stage for change.

PRACTICAL ADVICE

"In order for projects to be successful, it takes a high level of oversight. Its a multi-year process. it takes commitment from the organization." -CM



-Clearly conveying the vision of the project so it is understood well by staff, partners, and stakeholders (How you present the idea is just as important as the idea itself) -Understand your audience -Don't be discouraged if it doesn't work out the first time; be persistent and patient! There are

many avenues! -Projects are often interdisciplinary: "I hired an ecologist to work with us to help with seed selection."
